GERMAN CHORAL CLASSICS



SUNDAY 15 FEBRUARY 2015 AT 3PM KING'S COLLEGE CHAPEL, TAUNTON

The choir's recent exchange with the German choir *Berliner Kantorei* has drawn us into a wider and ever more enthusiastic exploration of the immensely rich German musical tradition, and in particular of how that tradition has enhanced our own.

For February's concert, thirteen composers have been chosen to demonstrate this. They are united by their mother tongue as well as by their musical language, although widely separated in both geography and time.

Six were born in what we now call Germany (Schütz, Bach, Handel, Mendelssohn, Wagner & Reubke), five in Austria (Haydn, Mozart, Schubert, Bruckner & Brahms), one in Bohemia (Mahler), and even one (Rheinberger) in Liechtenstein! Several of them - notably Handel, Haydn and Mendelssohn - were regular and popular visitors to Britain, Handel eventually becoming a nationalised Englishman and composing some of his greatest ceremonial music for the coronation of George II.

We will hear vivid and moving psalm settings by Schütz, Schubert, Mendelssohn and Reubke; a beguiling *Agnus Dei* from a Mass by Mozart; a lively chorale prelude from a Bach cantata and the wonderful closing chorus of his *St. Matthew Passion*; and a joyous *Te Deum* by Haydn.

Join us to ride with Wagner's Valkyries and to soar like a dove with Mendelssohn. Reverently enter into Bruckner's Catholic cathedral, and swell the crowds in Westminster Abbey with Handel; accompany some of Jesus's disciples on the road to Emmaus in a motet by Rheinberger; and bid farewell to earthly life with Mahler in a striking choral setting of one of his beautiful valedictory *Rückert-Lieder*, finally, we unite heart and soul in Brahms's magnificent *Geistliches Lied*.

We welcome again our virtuoso accompanist, **Richard Pearce**, who will also perform two exciting organ solos - perhaps you saw him playing in the Royal Albert Hall at the 2014 *Last Night of the Proms*?

Somerset Chamber Choir presents an irresistible opportunity to enjoy all these musical treasures in a single concert, at King's College Chapel in Taunton, as a winter afternoon fades into evening
