The tranquil ambience of the beautiful **Chapel of King's College, Taunton** on a winter's afternoon provides the atmospheric setting for a performance of the much-loved **Duruflé Requiem**. Duruflé's work was partly modelled upon Fauré's

famous setting and has earned a very special place in 20th century French music. Rooted in the composer's deep commitment to the Gregorian plainchant that provided the source of his musical and spiritual inspiration, the work is an extraordinary fusion of disparate elements - modal writing, subtle counterpoint and the sensuous harmonies of the composer's mentors, Debussy, Ravel and Dukas. The Requiem is placed at the heart of a programme which celebrates almost a century and a half of the most famous French sacred music. Poulenc's dramatic Lenten motets are part of a stream of religious works he composed after a lifechanging pilgrimage to the shrine of the Black Virgin at Rocamadour in the Dordogne, following the death of a close friend. Messiaen's masterly motet, a miniature masterpiece, acts as a foil to Langlais' exciting and inspiring mass setting for choir and organ - one of the finest to emerge from 20th century France.

Virtuoso organist, Richard Pearce, performs the lively first movement of Symphonie no 5 by Widor, organist-composer of Saint-Sulpice in Paris for over 60 years, whose lifetime spans the renaissance of French organ music. This is a theme and variations, reflecting, in a sense, the nature of the entire programme.
