

BACH Mass in B minor

Bach's Mass in B Minor is justly celebrated as one of the most impressive choral masterpieces ever composed. A glittering collection of Bach's finest vocal music, the Mass was compiled by the composer shortly before his death and intended as his musical monument.


For many, the work is one of the wonders of the world – the musical equivalent, perhaps, of Michelangelo's paintings in the Sistine Chapel in Rome, Christopher Wren's architecture in St Paul's Cathedral or Shakespeare's achievement as a playwright.

Even by Bach's own extraordinary standards, the emotional profundity and majestic proportions of this work are astonishing. It is this meeting of naked emotion and limitless skill that draws performers and audiences back to Bach's masterpiece again and again. The music is hugely varied, ranging in scale from the arresting opening with its majestic block chords, through impressive choruses framed by brilliant trumpet fanfares and fizzing string writing, to intimate, heartfelt solo arias and duets, often in partnership with beautiful solo instrumental writing.


